Annual Meeting (from Pg 1) CONEY HAS FILED LAWSUIT

Byron Coney reported that he filed a Complaint to Quiet Title on November 27 on behalf of "Byron D. Coney, [+ additional persons who were enrolled as students in Cleveland High School in 1943 and 1944]" versus Seattle School District No. 1. The Class Action asks the court to determine ownership of the Memorial Forest. The Attorney for SSD No. 1 asked that the suit be dismissed but an Order Denying Motion to Dismiss was issued on November 29. The following joined Coney as members of the Class Action: Stanley G. Ridings, Donald O. Clifford, Elaine M. Comerford, Patricia L. Ashcraft, Loretta Scott, Edward K. Boprey, Donald E. Case, Vincent R. Kerkof and James N. Gilbert.

Coney stated that the filing of the suit does not preclude the possibility of the parties reaching a negotiated settlement prior to any court action. It may take some time before the case is heard.

FISH AND ROSES

Washington State Cities in Schools (CIS) is a private, non-profit organization which is coordinating the Fish and Roses Project. Its purpose is to deliver personalized, accountable and coordinated education to the students of Cleveland High School. The facility is an integrated aqua culture/agriculture system consisting of an aqua culture building for the growing of fish and a garden/picnic area for the growing of roses and other horticultural delights.

The aqua center planning documents are in the final permit stage; the General and Sub-contractors are in place. Funds are available for the aqua culture center and construction will begin soon. Ted Howard, Principal, must find \$15,000 annually to provide electricity and insurance. The School District does not provide such funding.

Generous contributions for the Fish and Roses project have been received from The Boeing Company and Price-Costco.

Funds previously received for the paving stones in the rose and garden/picnic areas are in escrow but are not sufficient to proceed with the work in that portion of the project.
