Interim president **JoAnn Victor Smith '56** opened the meeting. Members received oral reports from board members covering the status

of our new, co-developed website with Cleveland High School, plans for the upcoming Memorial Day observance, efforts to revive the annual golf tournament, upcoming CHS school events, the association's finances and the reopening of Cleveland High School.

### Board elections

This year's candidates for the board included nine alumni for eight positions. **Vera Chan-Pool '91** opted to not run for re-election. Current board members **Pat Coluccio '47**, **Peggy Soong-Yaplee '71** and **Alison Sing '64**, however, did run for re-election. There were six additional candidates

# Thanks for making 2006 a great year

Thanks to our generous alumni, contributions reached an all-time high. Our Alumni Association received \$32,161 in contributions from 400 donors, many making multiple contributions throughout 2006.

## Eagle 100 Club

Our Eagle 100 Club ranks continue to grow year after year. Alumni who contribute \$100 or more in any given year are listed as a member of the prestigious Eagle 100 Club, and their names are annually listed in our Alumni Association newsletter.

In 2006, contributions totaling \$24,105, or 74.9 percent of our total donations, were given by Eagle 100 members.

There were 17 alumni who gave twice and one alumnus who gave three times.

## Surprise gifts

The sudden increase in donations was attributed to several large gifts that included \$5,000 from the Estate of Stella Drager toward our scholarship program. **Stella M. (Franckoviak) Drager '31** passed away on Sept. 8, 2005.

A second gift in the amount of \$2,000 was given by **Marjorie Gray Hadden** in the memory of Kenneth Selby, who served as principal of Cleveland High School when the Memorial Forest was donated by the Classes of 1942 and 1943 to commemorate their fallen classmates during World War II.

## Matching grant

In May, we received a \$2,000 Community Scholarship matching grant from the state's Higher Education Coordinating Board. The Alumni Association matched these funds and deposited them in our permanent Scholarship Endowment Fund.

Thanks to past contributions from our annual Golf Scramble and our success in obtaining a matching grant from this program, we now have \$14,208 invested toward our goal to permanently fund our annual scholarship program.

## Scholarship awards

Annually, our scholarship committee selects two or three Cleveland students to receive scholarship awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$1,500 to help them pursue their educational goals. These scholarship awards are deposited with the educational institution of their choice in accordance with our scholarship guidelines, and any funds not used by the students are returned to the Alumni Association for our reuse.

In 2006, we gave out three scholarships and one scholarship that was deferred from 2005, for a total of \$7,100. These four students will attend the University of Washington, Bellevue Community College, Western Washington University and Pacific Lutheran University.

## Scholarship Endowment Fund

To permanently fund our annual schol-

arship program, the Alumni Association established a permanent, irrevocable Scholarship Endowment in 2002.

We have set a goal of raising \$200,000 within the next five years. Once we reach this target, future scholarships will be awarded from the interest earned on this account.

Alumni who wish to donate directly to the Scholarship Endowment Fund may do so by selecting the new donation category, Scholarship Endowment Fund (Restricted), on the Alumni Donation Form on Page 6 of this newsletter. Please note that donations to this restricted category will not be used until we reach our target goal of \$200,000.

Meanwhile, we will continue to accept donations for our unrestricted Scholarship category to fund our current awards.

## Our investments

As we begin 2007, our alumni coffers are healthy. Our aggregate assets now approach \$81,513.

Following the death of our former treasurer, Terence L. Wong; the board authorized the treasurer to consolidate and diversify our assets within a single financial institution, Washington Mutual Bank.

Currently, we have adopted an investment strategy that maintains reasonable liquidity of our cash assets while capitalizing our ability to earn interest on our investments. Our goal is to open 12 Certificates of Deposits (CDs) that mature annually on a monthly basis. These will be reinvested unless it is determined that funds are needed to support one of our programs.

We have opened six individual CDs totaling \$30,900 thus far, and we are targeted to open three more in the coming year and three in the following year.

Our remaining assets include our checking (\$5,644) and savings (\$30,743) accounts, plus our permanent, irrevocable Scholarship Endowment Fund (\$14,224).

## Final note

Thanks to your generosity, the Alumni Association is poised to do much in the coming years. We look forward to the re-opening of our alma mater this fall.

# Memorial Forest gets its start

In 1943-44, there existed no student body president. Instead, Boys & Girls Club leaders would lead the student body for a half-year on a rotational basis.

In 1943, the science teacher proposed to the Student Council leaders, including president **Pat Guettel**, that the class purchase logged property on the Issaquah plateau and dedicate it as a memorial to Cleveland High School's World War II war dead.

The Class of 1943 had insufficient funds to purchase a class gift, but it had been set aside to use as a memorial. The Class of 1944 also had insufficient funds to buy this property, so it was decided to combine the funds to make a bid on the tax-delinquent property. Both classes worked very hard to raise the money; they had many activities, such as vaudeville, senior play, etc.

Mr. Hazzard suggested 162 acres, which was to be sold at a King County auction, and **Ray K. Imus** went to the auction to bid. He was to use the funds from the two classes to obtain the property.

When the auctioneer heard from Mr. Imus that the property was going to be used to honor our war dead, no one made a bid, including Mrs. William Boeing, who wanted the property to add to the Boeing estate. What would be done with this second-growth timber and this large site will be featured in an upcoming newsletter.

running, for a total of nine candidates for eight board positions.

**Bernie Moskowitz '57** coordinated the elections, and ballots were distributed to all eligible alumni. Each candidate gave a short statement about themselves, in addition to the printed bios that were handed out prior to the election.

No additional nominations came from the floor.

He recruited **Jack and Kit Carlton '57** and Seattle City Councilmember **David Della '73** to tally the ballots. Following the tally, Bernie announced that, with the exception of one ballot that was disqualified, there were 26 valid ballots. From those, the three incumbent board members (Coluccio, Soong-Yaplee and Sing) were re-elected.

Also, five new board members were elected:

■ **Michelle (O'Rebia) Burge '81** — She attended Cleveland from 1978 to 1981 and married a Franklin High School gradu-

ate, but Michelle is 100-percent Eagle. She said she sees how strong Franklin High School's alumni organization is and would like to grow our organization likewise.

■ **Ken Dorsett '54** — He has been married to Sandra Russo for 46 years. He taught social studies, math and language arts for 12 years at Washington Junior High School. A former educator and school administrator, Ken will bring these skills to our board.

■ **Ginny (Yazzolino) Ogle '64** — She grew up on Beacon Hill and now lives in West Seattle and works as medical assistant team coordinator at the Pacific Medical Center. Ginny has maintained close relationships over the years with her classmates, and she wants to help the board support Cleveland and its students.

■ **Jim Southcott '56** — A former mechanic and Greyhound bus driver, Jim lives just north of Cleveland High School. He brings his Eagles, Elks, Foresters, International Foot Print Association and American Legion experience to the table.

■ **Nicole Washington '80** — Nicole works for The Boeing Co. as a human resources specialist-in-training.
